




12:00 P.M.Barry Lack, Ary Stillman, From Impressionism to Abstract Expressionism







3:30 P.M.Aaron Cohen, Brotherhood of Warriors: Behind Enemy Lines with a Commando in One of the World's Most Elite Counterterrorism Units

Eighteen year-old Aaron Cohen left his privileged life in Beverly Hills to join Israel's most elite security force. After fifteen months of grueling training designed to make him a warrior, he became an expert in urban counter-terror warfare. He participated in over 200 life-or-death missions as part of a controversial "black ops" unit that abducted terrorist leaders from the Palestinian-controlled West Bank. Cohen shares his fly-on-the-wall view of a top-secret shadowy world that redefines strength, danger and security.


2:00 P.M.Yitta Halberstam, Small Miracles of the Holocaust:







ABOUT THE COVER:

The Arch, all that remains of the Hurva (not its original name-hurva means "ruins") Synagogue in the Jewish Quarter of Jerusalem's Old City, appears to lead directly into the core of the Shrine of the Book, located at the Israel Museum in the modern city of Jerusalem. The Hurva, built in the 1840s in grand Neo-Byzantine style was once one of the largest buildings in the Old City. The synagogue was destroyed during the 1948 war. After the Six-Day War, the Government of Israel restored one arch among the four arches that once supported the lofty dome that graced the synagogue. This arch became a symbol of the synagogue and many other institutions in the quarter. At present, the Hurvah is being restored and fully refurbished so that the site can once again be used as a Synagogue.
